



Review, Promotion, and Tenure (RPT)

Workflow system

- Materials begin with the candidate and end in OAA
- Ability to send materials back and forth through Interfolio
- Can collect external review letters

Faculty Activity Reporting (FAR)

- Faculty dossier
- Can have a designee assigned
- Will flow into RPT
- Can be used to build out website,
 CV, short vita, etc.
- Strongly encourage ALL new faculty to begin using FAR now




Faculty Foundation, Impact, and Transformation (FIT) Mentoring Program





Guiding Principles

- Independence
- Impartiality
- Confidentiality
- Informality

Independence

I do not report to anyone, except to the faculty senate, in very broad terms.

Impartiality

I do not take sides on any issues.

I do not represent or act as an advocate for anyone.

I do not tell faculty what to do (or not do).



Confidentiality

I do not tell on anyone, unless I'm legally required to as a mandated reporter.

Informality

I do not participate in any formal investigations.

I do not play a role in any formal resolution process.

I do not overturn any decisions of existing dispute resolution.

I do not make binding decisions.

I do not mandate policies.

I do not provide legal advice.



So, what do I do?

I help faculty identify and clarify issues.

I help faculty develop and consider options.

I coach faculty in navigating conflict.

I look into issues for faculty.

I provide information to faculty.



So, what do I do?

I provide upward feedback to leadership.

I observe, facilitate, or mediate discussions between faculty members and others.

I maintain confidentiality, with some exceptions.

What I've learned...

Develop positive, healthy relationships with your unit leaders.

Be present with your colleagues. Get to know them, so when things get hard, you can work through those hard times together.

Remember your students have a lot to learn, not just in the classroom, but in your labs, on your projects, in your office, on social media. Teach them.

When things in your work life change, talk with people about the changes – why they are being made and how they impact you and others.



What I've learned...

If you get into a bind, study the related policies and rules, connect with people who know them well, start with someone who you trust or can maintain your confidentiality.

If you have trouble finding the resources you need, ask for help.

We are all impacted by social, cultural, and legal events and practices beyond the university. Because these things are always evolving, there is constant conversation about these. Be a part of these conversations.

What is an Ombudsperson?

The Graduate and Professional Student (GPS) Ombuds is an independent, impartial and confidential* resource for students to discuss issues and receive informal counsel and advice.

The ombuds...

- guides students in identifying and reframing issues.
- helps explore options and make decisions
- assists in developing solutions and strategies to resolve conflict and empowers students with tools to solve problems, e.g., through coaching.
- in some cases, informally observes, mediates or facilitates communication among the parties involved.



Guiding Principles

Independence:

the GPS ombuds does not represent faculty or the university.

Confidentiality*:

 conversations with ombuds are confidential; no record is kept; BUT reporting responsibility with OCRC

Impartiality:

the GPS ombuds remains impartial to all parties involved in the situation.

Informality:

talking with the GPS ombuds is off-the-record.

^{*} The GPS ombudsperson has reporting obligations related to sexual misconduct and discrimination based on protected classes complaints. While the Ombud will discuss concerns in these areas with sensitivity and keep your information as private as possible, confidentiality cannot be guaranteed. For confidential resources for concern in these areas, please contact a confidential counselor.
