- Prestige: Election to the National Academy of Engineering (NAE) is one of the highest professional honors accorded to an engineer. It recognizes individuals who have made outstanding contributions to engineering research, practice, education, or leadership.
- Membership Profile: Members are elected from academia, industry, government, and nonprofit sectors, and as of 2024, NAE includes over 2,400 U.S. members and 300+ international members.
- Nomination Period: **February – May annually.**
- Who Can Nominate: For U.S. membership, a current NAE member must submit the nomination, supported by two additional references from active or emeritus members. For international membership, a member or international member may nominate, with two supporting references (at least two signatories must be active members).
- The Process: The entire process is **strictly confidential, and campaigning is prohibited**. Nominators and references are requested to maintain secrecy with regard to those being nominated for membership in the Academy. After nominations are made between February and May, peer committee reviews of nominees in various fields of engineering result in recommendations to the Committee on Membership for its consideration within guidelines established by the NAE Council. The final list of nominees is voted on by the entire membership of the NAE during the month of January with the results of the vote announced to the public in mid-February.
- Selection Criteria: Nominees must be recognized for professional integrity, and must have made significant contributions in one or more of the following:
 - Engineering practice, research, or education.
 - Pioneering new or emerging technologies, advancing traditional engineering fields, or innovating in engineering education.
 - Leading major engineering endeavors.
