Recently, three faculty members shared how Ohio State stands apart through its support for faculty at every stage of their professional journeys.



How Earth's molecules got their "handedness"

Scientists from Ohio State have a new theory about how the building blocks of life – the many proteins, carbohydrates, lipids and nucleic acids that compose every organism on Earth – may have evolved to favor a certain kind of molecular structure.

In the journal *ACS Earth and Space Chemistry*, co-authors James Cowan, Distinguished University Professor Emeritus in chemistry and biochemistry, and R.J. Furnstahl, professor of physics, now propose a new model of how the molecules of life may have developed their "handedness."

Supporting students and colleagues through tragedy

Our Shared Values call us to put people at the center of all that we do through care and compassion. Events around the country and world — from natural disasters to senseless violence — have impacted many of our students, faculty and staff as well as their families and loved ones. Resources are available at Ohio State to support students and colleagues:

• The Michael V. Drake Institute for Teaching and Learning has developed a <u>set of resources</u> that can be used by instructors to provide students support during difficult times.

• Following the tragic loss of life at Michigan State University, some campus community members have had questions about Ohio State's preparedness for a safety emergency. Police train countless hours to be prepared for emergency situations. In addition, the university has a <u>"Surviving an Active Aggressor"</u> video to educate the campus community. We encourage all Buckeyes to watch. Always report suspicious behavior on campus to OSUPD (614-292-2121) or off-campus to CPD (614-645-4545). Dial 911 in emergencies.

• If your cell phone number is already in Workday, then you are automatically registered for the <u>Buckeye Alert</u> text messaging system. Faculty, staff and students have the ability to register up to two additional cell phone numbers to receive text message notifications.

• Students who need assistance or emotional support can contact the Office of Student Life's <u>Counseling and Consultation Service</u>. Students can also access the support and resources provided by the <u>Student Wellness Center</u>, the <u>Student Advocacy Center</u>, the <u>Center for Belonging and Social</u> <u>Change</u> and the <u>Office of International Affairs</u>.

• Faculty or staff in need of assistance can contact Ohio State's Employee Assistance Program.

Faculty Resources: Promotion and Tenure

Supporting faculty and academic leaders in their personal growth and leadership development is a shared effort, and every faculty member and appointee should know that they have the full backing of the Ohio State community. The Office of Faculty Affairs is building a network of development programs

that serve faculty across their entire career life cycle with a focus on personal and professional growth, including career skills and competencies, leadership nurturing and communication approaches.

One of the new development programs is the <u>Telling Your Story workshop</u> on March 10. All faculty preparing their dossier for promotion and tenure review are invited to this half-day workshop. Participants will learn how to create a compelling professional narrative and how to clearly identify themselves as the central character of the story. **NOTE: participants should bring their narrative of professional achievements in whatever shape it is currently in**. Please know that some of the content will be recorded and made available on our website for those who couldn't make it to the workshop.
